Newcomer Orientation Survey 2020-07-08 (3/4)

- What did you dislike about the IEEE 802 Orientation Training program?
 - Did not provide details on best ways to get started in a work group, especially with virtual meetings.
 - Presenter followed up to all participants:
 - True, this session has not typically provided much WG-specific information, and meetings are run differently in different WGs. Some of the WGs run their own WG orientation meetings. For example 802.11 is doing one on 3 November. If you don't see such a program for your WG of interest, I suggest you consider attending the 802.11 one anyway, because I suspect that some of the information will help you. Also, consider attending the upcoming Plenary meetings of your WG, because you will get a good overview of the activity there.

Newcomer Orientation Survey 2020-07-08 (4/4)

- What additional questions do you have following the IEEE 802 Orientation Training program?
 - I attended a Study Group (WebEx) teleconference meeting prior to the orientation. Noticed at the SG and orientation meeting, participants had affiliations appended to their names in the participants list. I'm a novice with WebEx & attempted to do that at orientation and couldn't make it work. Was wondering how IEEE veterans do that. Would be nice if that was covered in orientation now that we have more teleconferences.
 - Presenter followed up to all participants:
 - I believe you can find instructions <u>here</u>. Some WGs have their members record their WG membership status in their display name; e.g. "[VM]" (for "voting member) at the start of the name field.

Presenter Survey 2020-07-08 (2/2)

- Do you have any suggestions for improvement in the slides or the process?
 - Text on Slide 27 (Affiliation) is hard to understand, though it is copied directly from the IEEE SA FAQ:
 - "An affiliation, as defined in the IEEE SA Standards Board Bylaws, 5.2.1.5, is an individual deemed "affiliated" with an individual or entity that has been, or will be, financially or materially supporting that individual's participation in a particular IEEE standards activity."
 - It would be better to quote 5.2.1.5 directly: "An individual is deemed "affiliated" with any individual or entity that has been, or will be, financially or materially supporting that individual's participation in a particular IEEE standards activity."
 - People are concerned with getting their participation credit. It may be best to refer to the WG for explicit details.
 - It would be useful for the presentation to identify the schedule of upcoming WG orientation programs.
- Approximately how many people attended the IEEE 802 Newcomer Orientation Training?
 - **12**

Recommendations

- The live orientation program should be repeated, in a similar time slot and duration, before future electronic Plenary Sessions.
- Advance promotional efforts should be strengthened, including reaching out to those not yet subscribed to reflectors
 - e.g. twitter
- A recording, with the slides and audio, could be made available.
 - The programs of 2020-07-08 and 2020-11-28 were not recorded due to objections raised during prior EC meetings.
 - The embedded audio partially resolves the issue and is easier to maintain, since slides can be updated without replacing all the audio.
