Summary of Activities and Future Plans

The Publicity Committee (PC) held one meeting for the week of November 10, 2003 chaired by Brian Mathews PC Chair 802.11 and Glyn Roberts PC Chair for 802.15. Summary update reports were received from Zigbee Alliance, WiFi Alliance, WiMedia Alliance.

Ron Moore of Via Licensing presented a proposal for Via Licensing to operate an IP licensing pool for the benefit of 802.11 IP licensors/licensees.

The meeting closed with a general discussion of press coverage of 802.11/15 topics.

At the IEEE 802Wireless Interim session in January the PC will receive reports from industry groups, discuss press coverage of 802.11 and 802.15, and discuss any needed changes to 802.11/15 external communications.
